Riding Specifics:

- 1. All students must ride in boots that fit snugly on their foot and has a heel. No sneakers or thick nubby bottom boots.
2. Proper helmets with a chinstrap are mandatory for riding. Any helmet approved by ASTM or the U.S. Pony Club.
3. We recommend that for all jumping and field work every rider wears a safety jumping vest.

Fees: A non-refundable deposit of \$30.00 must accompany this application.

It is realized that the riding school does not carry major medical insurance and that my (or our family) insurance should cover me during all riding at the Vershire Riding School. Riders bringing their own horse need to include a negative coggins.

Permission is given to use pictures and/ or video in which I may appear for camp material or advertising. I have read the brochure thoroughly and understand camp policy.

With reasonable care, riding, including jumping, is quite safe but we realize accidents can occur and will not hold the Stable liable assuming normal staff supervision. Under Vermont law, an equine activity sponsor is not liable for an injury to, or death of, a participant in equine activity resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities that are obvious and necessary, pursuant to 12 V.S.A. §1039 (3). P.S. Our record is excellent!

**Boarding Agreement**

**The Stable Owner agrees that:**

1. She will keep the horse in a stall and/or paddock described as follows: Box Stall & Turn out.

**Horse Owner agrees that:**

The State of Vermont requires that all horses entering the State be accompanied by an import permit (or negative coggins), and an official State Health Certificate. The Health Certificate can be obtained, and should be filled out, by your veterinarian. The certificate should be filed with your State veterinarian office so that a Vermont import permit can be obtained for your horse.

Due to a large number of horses that will present at the School this summer we are also requiring that all horses brought on the premises have the Coggins test for E.I.A., and be vaccinated against E/W, Rhino, Tetanus, West Nile Virus, Rabies and Equine Influenza. All animals should be positively identified by name and/ or registration number tattoo markings (if present) sex, age and color markings.

The Coggins test and vaccinations should have been given within the past 6 months. Vermont Horse Shows/Events are not letting any horse on the show grounds without a certificate of a negative Coggins.

All vaccinations must be completed at least 2 weeks prior to shipment to the Vershire Riding School.

Horse Owner: Agrees to hold the Vershire Riding School, its employees, students or agents harmless for any injuries or loss suffered during the boarding time whether or not such injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from negligent jobs or omissions of said stable owners, managers or students.

**Horse Owner and Stable Owner mutually agree that:**

1. In the event the horse shall require the services of a Veterinarian, Stable Owner will immediately contact Horse Owner. In the event Horse Owner cannot be reached, Stable Owner is here by authorized, as agent for Horse Owner, (a) to call Dr. Dave Lamb DVM and, should he be unavailable, (b) to call any other licensed veterinarian of her choice. All fees charged by said veterinarian shall be the sole and exclusive responsibility of the Horse Owner, with no liability whatsoever on the part of Stable Owner for such fees.

2. This document constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and there are no other agreements between them except as noted below.
